Ten years of welcoming

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Introduction

Welcome Office Friuli Venezia Giulia is the hospitality scheme for international students and researchers to the region. Developed within the SiS FVG – Scientific and Innovation System – which brings together 17 major research institutions based in Friuli Venezia Giulia, Welcome Office is managed by Area Science Park and aims to boost the attractiveness of the regional institutions. As its starting point it has the experience gained with the EURAXESS Service Centre, the pan-European initiative that supports the mobility and career development of researchers.

The shared organisational model promotes international hospitality by pooling the competences of individual partner institutions and thanks to a network of local and national Public Administration stakeholders collaborating with each other. These include police departments, prefectures, immigration offices, local health authorities, and municipal offices.

This report presents the main results and activities carried out by Welcome Office FVG since 2010, when the scheme was rolled out to the entire region, offering services, developing tools and providing support programmes for students and researchers arriving and staying in Friuli Venezia Giulia, and their host institutions.

The context



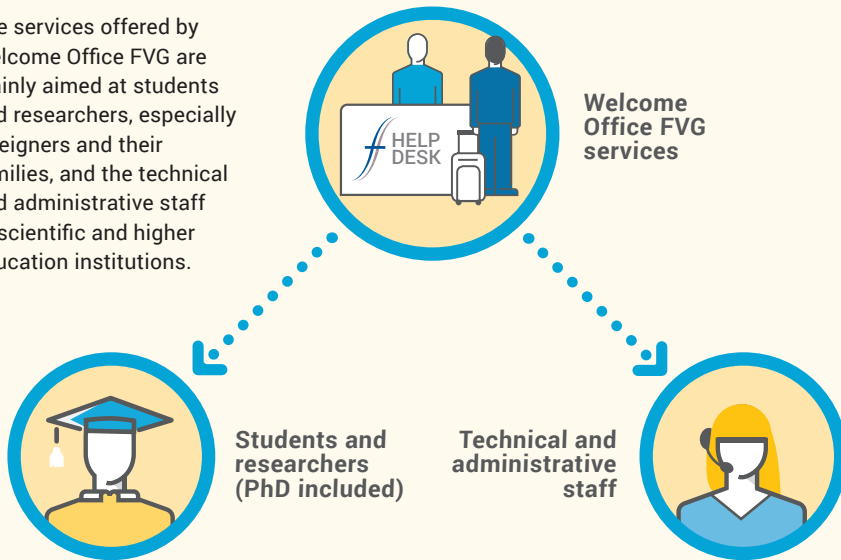
The scheme was developed to meet the need of the region's science and higher education institutes to develop, integrate and boost their existing hospitality services for the numerous international students and researchers who choose them every year.

It also acts as an umbrella organisation, providing support to the institutions by:

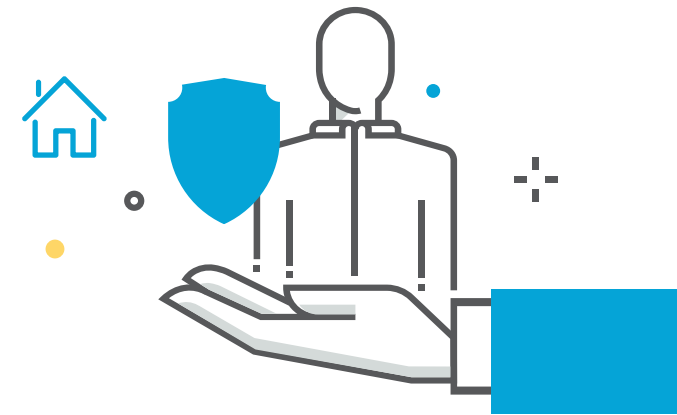
- liaising relations with public authorities to solve specific issues;
- offering targeted training and information;
- developing new tools/services to facilitate hospitality.

THE TARGET

The services offered by Welcome Office FVG are mainly aimed at students and researchers, especially foreigners and their families, and the technical and administrative staff of scientific and higher education institutions.



Welcome Office FVG activities




Support for students and researchers includes:

- pre-arrival information, with updates on www.welcomeoffice.fvg.it;
- on-site assistance via the Welcome Office help desks based in Trieste and Udine.

The website in English provides information about procedures for entering the country and aspects of everyday life (e.g. tax

identification number, health insurance, accommodation, language courses, foreign driving licences, etc.). Over the years it has been added with several online tools to help guests plan and organise their arrival and stay. These include the customisable To Do List of actions to be taken before leaving and upon arrival in Italy, a video tutorial and the Welcome Office FVG in a Nutshell infographic.

- networked information and targeted training to share new legislation and operating practices, in partnership with local and national public authorities (police departments, prefectures, immigration offices, health authorities,

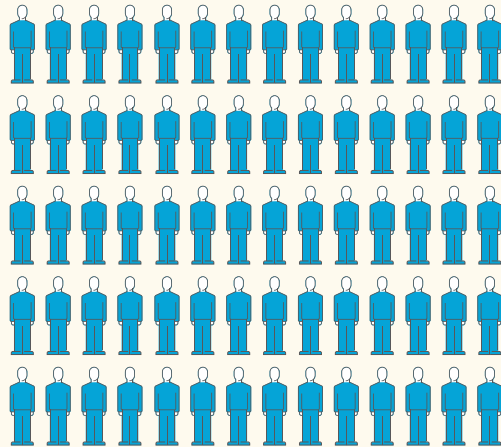
municipal offices, the Foreign Ministry's visa office);

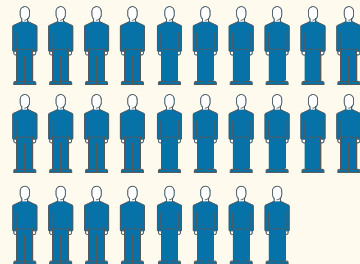

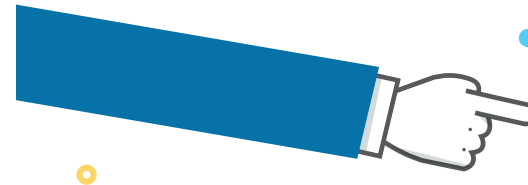

Internationalisation activities



Over the years, Welcome Office FVG has taken part in various projects and initiatives aimed at strengthening the international appeal of the region's research centres and universities and promoting the career development of researchers. The main activities include:

1) EUROPEAN COMMISSION SCHEMES TO INCREASE THE ATTRACTIVENESS OF HUMAN CAPITAL

EURAXESS - Researchers in motion

Pan-European Network supporting the mobility and career development of researchers in more than 40 countries through a network of over 597 service centres and information websites worldwide.

HRS4R - Human Resources Strategy for Researchers

HRS4R aimed at facilitating full adoption throughout Europe of the European Charter for Researchers and the Code of Conduct for the Recruitment of Researchers (C&C), through a series of actions that research institutions and universities can take on a voluntary basis to implement the C&C principles.



RESEAVER - Retirement Savings Vehicle For European Research Institutions

A Europe-wide pension scheme for researchers and personnel in the field of research to encourage mobility and attract talent through complementary pension solutions.

2) INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS

Talents Strategy

Programmes for incoming and outgoing international mobility for expert researchers: TALENTS, TALENTS UP, TALENTS FVG and TALENTS3.

Duration: 2010-2018.

The Trieste help desk



The Trieste help desk is managed by Area Science Park and was set up in 2009 as a pilot scheme as part of the “Trieste City of Knowledge” project. It offers students and researchers advice on the main aspects of mobility, including arrival and stay, health insurance, accommodation, moving with family members, etc. It complements the hospitality services offered by individual institutions and supports third parties such as companies, start-ups, universities and national public and private research centres. On average, around 1000 consultations are provided every year.

It also liaises with local authorities, such as the police, prefecture, Municipality of Trieste etc. and organises activities for a smoother arrival and stay in the city, such as collective pick up of residence permits, Welcome Office city tours, etc. Lastly, it takes part in scientific dissemination and outreach schemes, like the European Researchers’ Night and the Trieste Next Science Festival, as well as the welcome days some organisations arrange for their international guests.

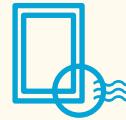

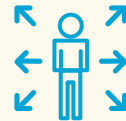

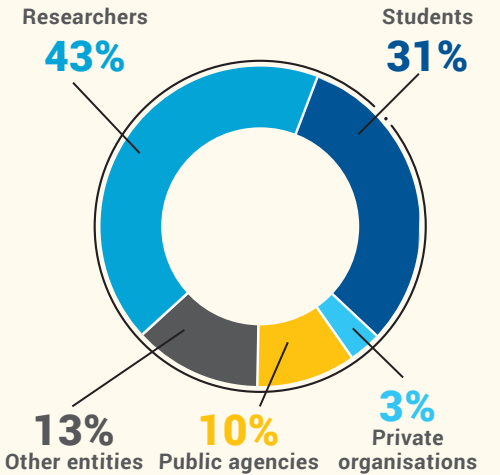

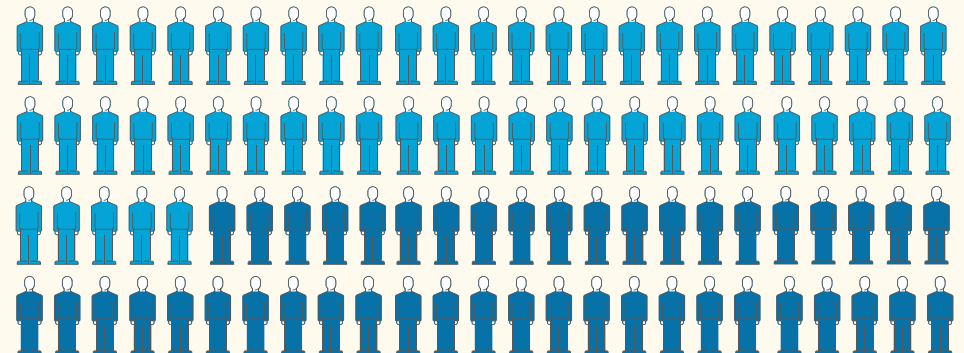

The Udine help desk



The help desk is managed by the University of Udine at the back of its experience with the International Student Service and was opened in 2010, one year after the Trieste office and alongside the roll-out of the Welcome Office FVG scheme across the region.

It provides services exclusively to users with links to the university. Its main target is incoming foreign students who have chosen the University of Udine for a period of study or research before returning to their own institutions. Over the years, support has been extended to international students enrolling at the university for full degrees or short courses and to incoming researchers. On average, around 7,600 consultations are provided every year.

The help desk is also involved in on-site services and works with the university during special meetings involving

international guests and the academic and administrative staff. Lastly, the university runs a EURAXESS centre providing hospitality to researchers.

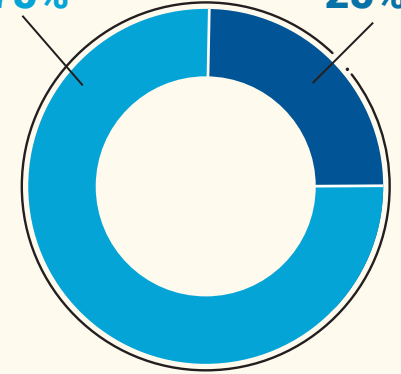

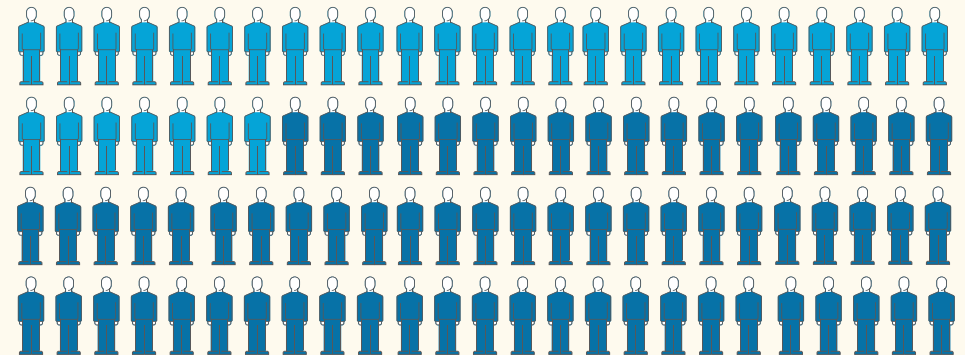

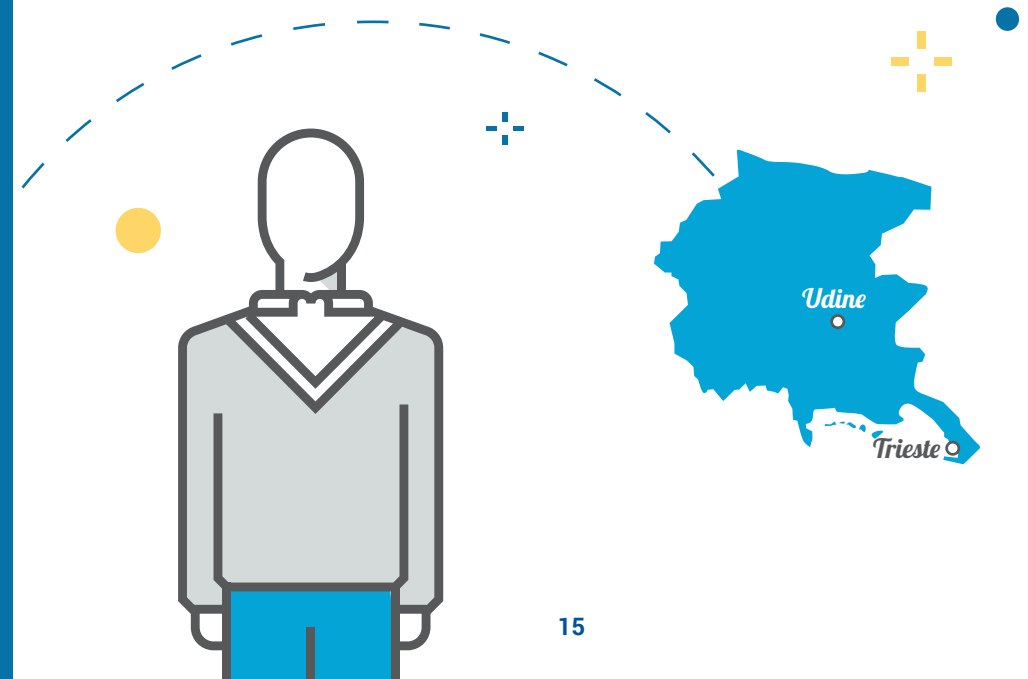
Conclusions

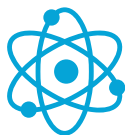
